## 2023 Outline for the Introduction to Fly Fishing Course

# Night 1 – Indoors at Venture Training Day Program building 4607 23<sup>rd</sup> Street,

- Take attendance, Vaccination status and remind about mask wearing as people arrive and assign numbers on name tags – Bill Kirkland or And Perry
- Introductions
  - o Club history, activities, mandate 5 minutes, Bill Kirkland
    - Introduce the instructors,
    - 100s of years experience
  - Course description and goals, 5 minutes, Jack Butula
    - Safe Covid habits, distancing, hand washing, stay home if sick or have symptoms
    - This course is Intended for beginners
    - Maximize fly casting time
    - Focus on lake fly fishing for trout
    - Find out expertise level of student, ask the students:
      - How many have been fly fishing? Once? A few times?Many times?
      - O Who can fly cast already?
      - O How many people cast with their left hands?
    - Hand out maps and manuals
    - Washroom directions
    - Name tags
    - Assign numbers to each student
    - If you are too shy to ask questions, you can hand your written questions to any of the instructors

#### **Outdoor session**

- Introduction to basic casting, Lyndon and Hu
- Yarn casting, Lyndon and Hu
- Transition to club House at 7:55- Ken K.I to moderate time, blow whistle

#### **Indoor session**

- Introduction to fishing Knots Barry
  - All the knots are in the manual
  - Knot websites on Page 22
  - Practise required at home to learn the knots
- Improved Clinch knot, Barry
- Non slip Loop knot, Jack (Barry is it better if you do all the instruction?)
- Surgeons Knot, Barry
- Surgeons Loop Knot and Loop to Loop connection, Barry
- Nail Knot. Jack
- Questions Lyndon and Barry
- Instructions for night 3, Jack and Lyndon
  - Instructors arrive half hour early for meeting
  - Students to arrive 20 minutes early to set up rods
  - Students are to bring complete rod/ reel and floating line with leader
  - o If students do not have a rod we have some loaner rods available
  - We will conduct lessons rain or shine, so prepare for the cold and wet.

#### **Outdoor Session**

- Assemble fly rods, all instructors,
- Lyndon to supply Yarn
- Casting theory, 15 minutes, Lyndon describing casts while Hu demonstrates casts
  - Explain and demonstrate the 5 principles.
- Pick-up and lay down
- Start basic false casting, for those who have mastered pick up and lay down
  - Left hander instructor, Lyndon or Hu
  - o Circulating instructors, Jack
  - One on one instructors, the rest
  - If students have a camera instructors or other students can video their casting for them.
  - Instructors will stress that the students should practice casting at home a few times before the following week.
- Assign students to specific instructors, Bill Kirkland
- Identify any students who are ready for more advanced instruction, all instructors
- Transition to club House at 7:55- Bill to moderate time, blow whistle

#### **Indoor Session**

- Describe instruction modules "Fishing through the Seasons", 5 minutes, Jack
- Break into small groups (Bill K) to discuss fly fishing techniques for:
  - o **Early Season Fishing,** approx. 10 minutes, Lyndon
  - o **Chironomid Fishing**, approx. 10 minutes, Tony
  - Mayfly Fishing, approx. 10 minutes, Jack
  - o **Damsel and Dragon Fly Fishing**, approx. 10 minutes, Bob Tate

- Break into small groups to discuss fly fishing techniques, 2 minutes, Bill
  - Sedge (Caddis) Fishing, approx. 10 minutes, Tony
  - o Summer Doldrums and Attractor patterns, approx. 10 minutes, Lyndon and Bob
  - o **Fall Fishing**, approx. 10 minutes, Jack
  - o River Fishing, approx. 10 minutes, Ron Reitsma
- Bill to moderate time, blow whistle
- Questions, 5 minutes Bill
- Instructions for night 5
  - Students to be set up and ready to go by 6:30 to make use of Daylight
  - Instructors to arrive 6:15 for meeting
  - If the beach is closed for some reason or the weather is too difficult, we will meet back at Polson Park
  - It is important the students practice casting at home during the week.
